We learn, also, by a letter from Mr. William S. Taylor, of Montgomery county, that the name of M. W. Cartwright, who was in the battle of San Jacinto and participated in the preceding campaign, was omitted in the list of names we published in TRE. ALMANACO of 1800. Mr. Cartwright belonged to Captain William Ware's company, and foot from the limit during the battle.
